Hospital Sisters Mission Outreach was privileged to support a life-saving trip to Haiti. This is an excerpt from a letter sent to Mission Outreach by Carol Strzelczyk.

We arrived in our village after three hours of long travel from the airport in Port Au Prince and as we pulled into the village, we could see the joy on the faces of the people from the village. The people who prayed for help were finally assured that God always answers prayers, and in a humbling way, we were part of that answer to prayer. Even more of an answer to prayer was all the medical supplies we were bringing from your facility.

"Thank you for the medical supplies donated for Haiti. As we went down, we had no clue how much the Chikungunya virus was affecting Haiti. As we soon found out in the clinics, all the medications that were donated were in great need. They had no help with the high fevers or after effects of this virus so the supplies were in high need. I was so thankful that you donated these items so we could give hope and love to many people."

All the items we had packed along were just what was needed. It seems like they multiplied like the loaves and fishes, but the packing was birthed before departing with the most amazing products. To continue doing the things we set forth to accomplish would be impossible without the generosity of those donations. The simplest things are coveted in a fifth world setting. To give hope in dosages that are tangible makes healing a reality. Grateful beyond words for being able to deliver that. Thank you is not enough-but it is truly heartfelt."

More than 66,900 pounds of medical supplies are processed and entered into the Mission Outreach inventory each month. Volunteers provide critical support to make these supplies available to people in need around the world.

Volunteers sort and package supplies, providing order in supply utilization and allowing doctors and nurses to focus on the patients.
